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## HASTECS a typical MDO process for future Hybrid Electric aircrafts

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 Engine benefits: design and operation may be revisited with power hybridization



✓ Aerodynamic benefits: several concepts

- Energy benefits: turboshaft efficiency
  - $\eta_{\text{GT}}$  ~ 10% for thermal descent or taxi
  - $\eta_{\text{GT}}$  ~ 90% for electric descent or taxi





## **Context: towards more electric greener aircraft**

- Geometry (propeller, emotor)
- Mechanical (gearbox)
- Electromagnetic (emotor)
- Electrical (bus voltage)
- Source sizing (fuel cell, turboshaft)
- Energy management

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### Design of highly integrated eMotor with its cooling

Several drivers to increase both specific power and efficiency

To decrease electric machine (PMSM) mass

 Increase peripheral speed up to 200m/s with sleeve having Strength tensile > 1600MPa

 Increase current densities:  $J_{rms}$  > 25A/mm<sup>2</sup> et K<sub>rms</sub> > 100 kA/m for internal cooling inside slots

#### Increase flux density in air gap:

high temperature permanent magnets (SmCo or NdFeB): Br(SmCo) = 1.16T for Bm=0.9T

Increase number of pole pairs:

Halbach, Np > 10

To decrease cooling system mass

**Decrease losses** 

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decrease Joule losses (DC and AC): Twisted Litz wires

High filling coefficient

> $R_{AC}/R_{DC}$ ~1 for 400Hz @ 5kHz

Decrease iron losses:

- Use thin magnetic sheets (very thin sheets 100-200µm

MDO of the whole powertrain integrating snowball effects at aircraft level

Multidisciplinary model based on analytical or surrogate models (regression models) for facing complexity issue.

#### EMS is optimized: hybrid ratio become additional decision variables



Conclusion: hybrid aircraft with heavier powertrain and potentially "greener" especially cumulating energy gains with aerodynamic benefits due to distributed electric propulsion

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Prospect: the actual breakthrough may be the ZeroE-H2 : with HASTECS models and using same MDO process, the MTOW of a ZeroE H2 should be +25% heavier than an optimized full thermal regional aircraft
